QUICK REFERENCE SHEET FOR TENSE TRANSLATION

You will see these endings: except for sum You will translate as follows:

-ō -mus sum sumus -s -tis es estis sunt -t -nt es

(also possum, absum, adsum)

verb. verbS

AM (IS, ARE) verbING DO (DOES) verb

IMPERFECT

This tense should be the easiest tense to recognize. Why not start with it?

You will see these endings: except for sum You will translate as follows: -bāmus WAS (WERE) verbING -bam eram erāmus -bās -bātis STARTED (BEGAN) TO verb erās erātis

KEPT verbING -bat -bāmus erant erat (also possum, absum, adsum) USED TO verb

> WOULD [routinely] verb TRIED (WAS TRYING) TO verb

verbED, ATE, WENT

PERFECT

You will see these unique endings: You will translate as follows:

verbED, ATE, WENT -imus

HAS (HAVE) verbED, EATEN, GONE -istī -istis -it

-ērunt DID verb

Note: -it can also occur in 3rd, 3rd-iō, 4th in present: currit, arripit, audit.

Note: -imus can also occur in 3rd and 3rd-iō in present: currimus, arripimus, BUT audīmus (also ferimus)

SOME PERFECT TENSE FORMS HAVE UNIQUE ENDINGS, SO LEARN THOSE ENDINGS:

occurrī = perfect (unique ending) occurrō = present occurris = present occurristi = perfect (unique ending) occurritis = present occurristis = perfect (unique ending) occurrunt = present occurrērunt = perfect (unique ending)

SOME PERFECT TENSE FORMS SHOULD BE FAIRLY EASY TO RECOGNIZE:

amat = present (1st conjugation -a-) amāvit = perfect tense (no -a-, -v-, ending -it)

mittimus = present (3rd conjugation: -imus) mīsimus = perfect tense (-imus, but long -ī-, added -s-)

READ CAREFULLY!

venit = present tense vēnit = perfect tense cucurrimus = perfect tense currimus = present tense voluimus = perfect tense volumus = present tense

MEMORIZE THESE PERFECT STEMS:

sum→fuī ferō→tulī
