- Intro Words
 - adeō = so much, to such an extent, so (adv.)
 - ita = thus, in such a way, so (adv.)
 - sīc = thus(ly), in this way (adv.)
 - tālis, -e = such (a kind of, adj.)
 - tam = so (adv.)
 - tantus, -a, -um = so great, such great (adj.)
 - tantum = so much, so greatly (adv.)
 - tot = so many (adj.)
 - accidit = it happens/happened (also fit < Ecce 34, verb)

Result Clauses

Requirements for Result Clause

- intro word
- ut (for positive results) = that
 - ut nōn (for negative results) = that...not
- + verb in subjunctive
- Sextus tam perterritus erat ut ex arbore dēscendere timēret.
 - Sextus was so frightened that he was afraid to climb down from the tree.
- Sextus tam perterritus erat ut ex arbore nōn descenderit (perfect subjunctive).
 - Sextus was so frightened that he did not climb down from the tree.
- “Accidit ut esset lūna plēna.” (Caesar, B.G. 4.29)
 - It happened that there was a full moon.
 - Anything that “happens” is the result of something.
